Rules and Regulations

- 1. Subscribers will pay promptly the first of each month for rents, tolls and long distance messages of village phones; and the first of each quarter for rents, tolls and long distance messages of rural phones. In case of any default in payment, or of other breach hereof, the Telephone Company may disconnect or remove the instruments, but such action shall not affect the subscriber's liability for payment.
- 2. Conversations are limited strictly not to exceed five minutes for each message. Do not make it necessary for the operator to call time on you.
- 3. By "Subscriber" is meant the immediate members of the family of the party in whose house the phone is installed.
- 4. Non-subscribers will be charged ten (10) cents per message for use of rural lines and same will be charged to party over whose phone message is sent.
- 5 This company does not undertake to receive, transmit or deliver any messages, written or verbal, and will not under any circumstances be responsible for such messages if received or transmitted by its employees.
- 6, In all cases of emergency, such as fire, sickness, accident, etc., you are to give the party wishing to make call the right of way, the same as you would expect under like circumstances.

- Instruments and circuits are subject to the rules of the Telephone Company, made from time to time, for the management thereof, and to be used only by the subscriber, or by its agents or employees engaged in his business, and not for receiving or transmitting any message or communication in respect of which a consideration has been or is to be paid to any party other than the Telephone Company, except as may be permitted by said rules, nor in any messenger business; and are not to be removed from said premises, nor connected with any instruments or apparatus not furnished by the Telephone Company.
- 8. Profane or indecent language, quarreling or fighting over the wires, playing with the telephone or interfering during communications, will be a sufficient cause for the removal of the telephone. Subscribers will be held responsible for the enforcement of this rule.
- 9. The Telephone Company shall have the right to enter the subscriber's premises to attach, renew, alter, repair or remove its instruments and connections.
- 10. Subscribers desiring telephone moved from one location to another, will be charged one-half of cost occasioned by such removal.
- 11. Office Hours: Office opens at 6 o'clock a. m. and closes at 9:30 p. m. from April 1st to Oct. 1st; and opens at 7:00 o'clock a. m. and closes at 9:30 p. m. from Oct. 1st to April 1st.

Night Calls. Ten cents toll will be charged for any call after 9:30 p. m.

Instructions.

Report any trouble to Central Office promptly.

Operators are not permitted to carry on conversations.

Subscribers on rural lines, before attempting to use phone, should take receiver from hook, place it to the ear and say "Hello!" Then if the line is not in use, give one ring for central, or the ring for any party desired. Again take the receiver off the hook, place it to the ear and in case of call to central, await the operator's request for "number." Respond promptly by giving the number and call (where there is a call) in order printed. Thus: Two-six for (26); O, one-two-four for (O-124). When through talking, hang the receiver up properly (big end down) and give one ring to signal the operator to disconnect. Be sure to ring off when through talking. The lips should be about one and one-half inches from the transmitter when talking.

Do not use phone during elictrical storms. While not absolutely dangerous, sneak currents may give you a severe shock. Operators are warned not to remain at the board during electrical storms.

Any person or persons found guilty of breaking insulators, molesting, or in any way damaging or destroying any property belonging to this company, will be dealt with according to law.

Operators are expected to be patient and polite under all circumstances. Kindly accord to them a like consideration.
